#### **Conclusion of Induction Programme**







#### Report on the Virtual Induction Programme for M.Sc. First Year Zoology 2020-21 Batch held on

15<sup>th</sup> January 2021 from 04.00 pm to 06.00 pm on the Zoom Online Platform



COVID19 is perhaps one of the worst natural disaster and perhaps the most difficult one of this century. When the world was already gripped by economic and geopolitical uncertainties, Covid19 added to the woes of mankind and shaked the socio-economic fabric of the world to its core.

In the backdrop of the COVID19 pandemic situation and the delay in examination and subsequent admission of students to different courses, the College initiated this practice of inducting newly admitted students to its departments.

In view of the current epidemic, this programme was held virtually using Zoom Online Platform. This was done to minimize physical contact and reduce the risk of contagion.

The Zoom session was launched at 03.50 pm to let all participants to comfortably join the programme. The induction programme was initiated and presided over by the Principal, Dr. Ganeshchandra N. Shinde.

#### **President's Address**

The Principal, Dr. Ganeshchandra N. Shinde, welcomed all the students to the College and the Department. In his address, the Hon'ble Principal elaborately traced the history of this Department, its past achievements and its tradition. He elaborately discussed the highlights of the New Education Policy, its provisions and the major changes proposed therein. The Principal stressed the need for reforms in syllabus and course structure for the current courses to conform to the New Education Policy. He also amply emphasized the need for infusing creativity in teaching approaches and at the same time inculcating the culture of free and flexible learning in students.

He traced the objectives of Higher Education in India, in terms of skill enhancement, development of research aptitude and employability of students. At the same time he also laid stress on quaality research by teachers. The features and benefits Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) were very lucidly described by the Principal. He discussed freedom of choice of subjects and papers available to the students; especially the lateral movement of students accross different institutional frameworks.



Skill enhancement, value added and add-on courses were the next point of discussion by the President. He introduced the different said courses offered by the Department and strongly suggested that the students take up one of these courses. The Principal elucidated the different modes of teaching, both offline and online, that are adopted by the faculty members; also he motivated the teachers to further enrich their teaching with incorporation of modern developments in IT.

Firstly, he discussed in depth the theory papers of first semester, i.e. Theory Paper I: Invertebrates: Structure and Function, Theory Paper II: Biosystematics, Taxonomy and Evolution, Theory Paper III: Economic Zoology and Animal Behavior, Elective Theory Paper IV: Conservation Biology or Quantitative Biology & Bioinformatics, and Theory Paper V: Seminar. Mr. Rao also elaborated on the option of completing any One of the Online MOOCs offered by NPTEL-SWAYAM platform of the Government of India.

Later, he described the theory papers of second semester, i.e. Theory Paper VI: Animal Ecology, Toxicology and Environmental Pollution, Theory Paper VII: Gamete Biology and Animal Development, Theory Paper VIII: Biochemistry and Immunology, Elective Theory Paper IX: Pathobiology & Medical Zoology or Tools & Techniques for Biology, and Theory Paper - X: Seminar.





Dr. H. L. Tamloorkar gave a brief introduction about the general rules, regulations, and discipline adopted by all the members of the Department of Zoology.



Dr. D. B. Bhure conveyed the vote of thanks.


