The paper should have Abstract, Key words, Introduction, Literature Review, Objectives, Research Gaps, Methodology, Limitations / Scope for Future Work, Conclusion.

In the first page of the paper (Cover page), please provide full names (first, middle and last names) and full addresses (Institute s address along with designation and correspondence address) along with email address of the author(s). The author s name or affiliations should not appear anywhere else in the body of the manuscript to facilitate in blind peer review process.

The manuscript should be between 1500 and 3000 words including tables, figures, and appendix given at the end. Headings and subheadings must be short and not numbered. The primary heading should be in capitalized form (upper case), and bold face. The sub-headings should be in title-case capitalization (first letter of each word in capital) and in bold.

Research Paper must be typed in Times New Roman with 12 Font size, Heading Bold and Single line spacing.

Attach soft copy of payment receipt along with the transaction id with the research paper.

Papers received after the mentioned date will not be considered for publication.

# Places of Interest in and near Nanded city;

Nanded, a city in Maharashtra, India, is rich in history, culture, and spirituality. Here are some places of interest in and near Nanded:

- 1. Hazur Sahib (Sachkhand Sahib): One of the five Takhts (seats of authority) of Sikhism, Hazur Sahib is a major pilgrimage site. The gurdwara marks the place where Guru Gobind Singh, the 10th Sikh Guru, spent his last moments. The complex is grand and houses several important Sikh relics
- 2 Nanded Fort: Located on the banks of the Godavari River, Nanded Fort is a historical site with remnants of its past glory. Though much of the fort is in ruins, the location offers a scenic view and a glimpse into the Maratha and Mughal eras.



- 3. Mahur Fort: About 130 km from Nanded. Mahur is a historically significant site. known for the ancient fort and the Renuka Devi Temple. It's also believed to be the birthplace of Lord Dattatreya, making it a spiritual destination.
- 4. Aundha Nagnath Temple: Around 64 km from Nanded, Aundha Nagnath is one of the 12 Jyotirlingas dedicated to Lord Shiva. The temple is known for its architectural beauty and religious significance.
- 5 Kandhar Fort: Situated about 50 km from Nanded, Kandhar Fort is an ancient structure built during the Rashtrakuta period. It is known for its defensive walls. bastions, and the moat that surrounds it.
