

Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) Report 2020-21

In 2020-21, Yeshwant Mahavidyalaya, Nanded conducted Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) on Teaching Learning Process. During this survey, the guidelines of NAAC were appropriately adhered to.

798 students from programmes of all 3 faculties offered by the college, viz., Commerce (131), Humanities (238) and Science & Technology (429), participated in this survey. This included students from UG (644) as well as PG (153) programmes and a doctoral scholar. UG programmes offered by the college are of 3 years duration & PG programmes are of 2 years duration and the survey was responded by students of all years of both level programmes.


A summary of the responses of students to different questions related to Teaching Learning Process, along with the graphical and brief descriptive analysis, follows:



Almost half of the total surveyed students have reported that 85-100% of the syllabus was covered in the class by the teachers. More than one third of them were of the opinion that 70-84% of it was covered in the class.



2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes? 798 responses 3. How well were the teachers able to communicate? ⁷⁹⁸ responses




Teacher communication was experienced to be effective above satisfactory level by 82.2% students.

3/4th of the students found teacher's approach to teaching to be either excellent or very good.


5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers. ⁷⁹⁸ responses

6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?



77.9% of the students remembered frequent discussions with them about assignment performances.


7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students.

70.2% of the students remarked that the institute takes either regular or often active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities to them.


8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth. ⁷⁹⁸ responses

9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.




The institute was assessed to be successfully providing multiple opportunities to learn and grow by 84.6% students.

81.7% students felt fairly informed about expected competencies, course and programme outcomes.




11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you. ⁷⁹⁸ responses

79.5% mentees were convinced that mentor teachers had necessary follow-up with assigned task.


12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.




Enough coverage of important component of illustrating concepts through examples and applications was acknowledged by 86.7% students.

13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges. ⁷⁹⁸ responses




14. Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them. ⁷⁹⁸ responses





15. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process. ⁷⁹⁸ responses




The institute's efforts to engage students in monitoring, review and quality improvement of teaching learning process were credited by 82.4% students.


79.6% students found student centric methods adopted by institute/teachers to be of enough extent.

82.9% students agreed to have been recipients of encouragement by teachers for participation in extracurricular activities.


 Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.


81.3% students felt to be benefitted by efforts of institute/teachers considerably in acquiring various skills.


84.8% students observed that there has been more than 50% use of ICT tools in teaching.

85.6% students were in agreement with overall quality of the teaching-learning process in the institute to be good.


21. How do you feel overall about online / Virtual mode of teaching learning? ⁷⁹⁷ responses

The attendance percentage for virtual or online mode was self-evaluated by the students as follows :




24. Problems encountered while attending the online classes.




More than 90% students were satisfied about receipt of e-content in various forms as well as question banks and practice tests

25. Syllabus, Text, Notes, Explanatory Videos, Youtube links are provided by the teachers. ⁷⁹⁷ responses



27. The marks scored by you in the tests are communicated to you.




Above 85% of students acknowledged that they were communicated the marks scored by them in tests.

71.6% replied positively about online/virtual teaching, learning and evaluation pattern being useful to them in facing semester end examinations and 61.3% students found that this mode was effective to more or less extent for them.
